You can't beat our location along the TransCanada highway, just 30 minutes east of Brandon and 20 minutes north of the beautiful Spruce Woods Provincial Park. Our central location makes for an easy commute to other centres including Winnipeg, Portage la Prairie, Neepawa and Shilo.

Although Carberry has a small-town feeling, we have all the amenities you need. The Carberry Child Care Co-op offers licensed child care and nursery school programs and our elementary and high school are home to students from kindergarten to grade 12. The Carberry Health Centre houses a number of health services including ten acute care hospital rooms, emergency services, diagnostic services, an attached personal care home and the Carberry Clinic with two doctors and a nurse practioner onsite. Core businesses include two grocery stores, two gas stations, a hardware store, restaurants, mechanics, banking facilities and much more.

Recreational facilities and programs provide opportunities for all ages and interests. The Carberry Plains Community Centre is truly the hub of our community, and houses a hockey/skating rink, curling rink, bowling alley, outdoor pool, outdoor rink, skate park and shooting range. Utilities

Water and Sewer

The Town of Carberry is located on an aquifer which yields an excellent supply of fresh water fit for human consumption. Residents obtain water from individual private wells, and therefore do not require any water hook-ups from the Town upon moving in and do not receive monthly water and sewer bills. Cost of sewer service is included with annual property taxes.

We do recommend testing your water annually for coliforms and e. coli. Early spring after snow melt is a good time to test. The Town office can provide you with sample bottles and instructions for having your drinking water tested.

Waste Disposal Tips

Do not flush anything but toilet paper

Even though a product may be small enough to flush, doesn't mean it should be. Flushing items that are not meant to be flushed, including those labelled "flushable" can lead to problems in the sewer system. Do not flush tissues, paper towel, feminine hygiene products, baby wipes, medication or trash of any kind.

Disposing of Cooking Oil

Do not pour cooking oil down the drain. This clogs our pipes and sewer system. Instead, simply pour it into a disposable container, wait for it to cool and throw it in the trash!

Property Taxes

Property taxes are billed annually and are due at the end of September. Discounts apply for early payment: 1.5% to June 30th, 1% to July 31st and 0.5% to August 31st. A 1.25% late fee will be charged on unpaid taxes and will be added the first business day of every month after September 30th.

You may pay your property taxes in a number of ways:

Mail: Enclose the bottom portion of your tax bill with your cheque or money order made payable to: Town of Carberry | Box 130 | Carberry, MB | R0K 0H0

In Person: The Town of Carberry Office at 44 Main Street, Carberry. Please bring your tax notice(s) with you.

Online Banking: When adding Town of Carberry as your payee, search for "Town of Carberry". Your account number is your roll number (do not enter the decimal). If your roll number is only 5 digits and you need 9, enter zeros (0) in front of your roll number to make up a total of 9 numbers.

E-transfer: We have auto deposit for e-transfers. Please use email address town@townofcarberry.ca. Please note there are daily limits for e-transfers so pay early.

The Town of Carberry Office accepts prepayments in any amount for taxes throughout the year by post-dated cheque or any of the above payment methods.

Remember to save your tax bill for your income tax preparer the following year.

Pet Ownership

Licenses are required for all cats and dogs over the age of four months in the Town of Carberry. This license is free of charge with evidence of rabies vaccination. A tag for each pet will be provided and should be securely fastened to the pet's collar. If your pet is ever lost this tag will help us easily identify and return them.

A maximum of three dogs and three cats (over the age of four months) are allowed at any one premises unless the owner holds a valid kennel permit.

Dogs and cats are not permitted to run at large. Keep your pets leashed and under your control unless secured on your property. A dog park is located at the north entrance of town beside the Day Lily Park to allow your pup to run unleashed. Please respect all park rules.

Be a considerate neighbour and do not allow your pet to bark or howl or cause harm or threat to others. Clean up your dog poop promptly, both on public and private property. Dog waste bags and waste receptacles are available throughout the community.

Unlicensed private child care

Carberry provides excellent opportunities for operating a business. Our prime location along highway #1 and highway #5 provides easy access to workforce, suppliers and customers. Business and Development Incentives

The Town of Carberry offers several incentive programs to support economic development.

Downtown Heritage District Grant

The Downtown Heritage District Grant encourages building owners to perform façade renovations to their buildings. Applicants are eligible to apply for the 50/50 matching grant up to a maximum amount of \$3,000 once every year.

Development Tax Incentives

Commercial, Industrial, Downtown and Residential Development Tax Incentives are available to promote new development and expansions within the Town of Carberry by providing a tax reduction over three to ten years. The rebate amount is determined on a case to case based on development costs and other factors specific to the proposed development. The table below is used as a guideline for the incentives.

| Project Cost | Rebate |
|-----------------------|---|
| 25% of Assessed Value | 25% tax reduction for 3 years, max \$12,500 |
| \$50,000 - \$99,999 | 33% tax reduction for 5 years, max \$33,000 |
| \$100,000 - \$249,999 | 40% tax reduction for 5 years, max \$100,000 |
| \$250,000 | 66% tax reduction for 10 years, max \$165,000 |

History

Between 1878 and 1890, thousands of settlers from the East moved to take up the 160-acre homesteads offered by the government of John A MacDonald to settle the Big Plains. Their wives and children began to arrive in 1879, and the farming district of the Carberry Plains was born, whose outlines coincide almost exactly with the boundaries of the Rural Municipality of North Cypress, an area of 278,000 acres. Many of the farmsteads around Carberry today bear the names of the settlers who arrived in 1878.

The town of Carberry owes its origin to the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR), as well as to the RM's enterprising settlers. In 1882, the CPR established a station at De Winton, a small town-site about 1 1/2 miles east of the town's present site. Several of the railway's officials quietly purchased much of De Winton's town-site property, hoping for great profit as the town grew. Such speculation was strictly against the Railway's company rules, however, and on discovering the violation, the Railway Company, using 100 specially-hired men, in one night physically moved the new station to the present site of the town of Carberry!

Carberry was named after Carberry Tower in Musselburgh, Scotland (belonging to Lord Elphinstone, a director of the CPR) by James J. Hill, another CPR director and later President of the Great Northern Railway.

Next door to the Museum, visit our fully-restored Gingerbread House, a unique and stunning tribute to a fanciful architectural style. One of only three in Canada.

Access to the cemetery and memorial plaque is via a gravel road leading south from Provincial Road 351; a "Camp Hughes Cemetery" and a "Self Guided Tour Trenches" sign point the way.

In addition to emergency and law enforcement services for the area, the office also provides criminal records check, fingerprints, vulnerable sector check, general information, document verification, non emergency complaints, firearm enquiries, and special occasion licences.

Ambulance

The Prairie Mountain Health EMS (ambulance) provides emergency response for the communities of Carberry and Glenboro and surrounding areas. All residents making 911 calls are transported to the nearest open emergency department.



The Carberry Plains Service of Seniors organization provides support services to retired seniors, handicapped individuals, the frail and at-risk elderly to enable them to maintain the ability to live independently in the Town of Carberry and Municipality of North Cypress-Langford.

They arrange services and activities including communal meals, visiting, recreation programs, Victoria Lifeline emergency response units, income supplement forms, disabled parking permit applications and HandiVan bookings.

The Carberry Plains Service for Seniors takes bookings for the Handivan Service. The Handivan provides transportation services for those with mobility challenges. They provide in town and out of town transportation for medical, personal, social and recreational use. The Handivan must be booked 24 hrs in advance. In cases where bookings exceed capacity, medical/emergent bookings shall take priority.

As of July 2022, fees are as follows (may be subject to change):

- \$8.00 for in town trips (up to a maximum of 6 km)
- Out of town trips \$5.00 per person plus .70 cents per kilometer
- Booklet of 5 in town ride \$40.00 / book
- Handivan ticket books can be purchased at the Town of Carberry office or at the Service for Seniors office.

If you are not able to afford this service, applications can be made, in writing, to Carberry North Cypress-Langford Community Needs Fund to cover the cost of Handivan user fees on an individual basis.
