2. Judging will be done the Friday before the Fair – July 3th at 1:00 p.m.
3. Exhibitor entry tags to be attached and remain attached to all exhibits.
Glossary: One Bloom – one stem with a flower in full bloom and attached leaves.
One Stem – one stem with one or more blooms, buds and attached leaves.
4. Names or markings indicating names of owners must not appear on anything until judging is completed.
5. Exhibitor is limited to one article in each section in all classes.
6. In the absence of competition in any section or in case of exhibits of inferior quality, the judges will exercise their discretion to the prize awarded, if any.
7. All articles must be the property of the exhibitor and must be made by the exhibitor. No articles previously exhibited will be accepted.
8. Neither the Society nor any of the officials there of, shall be responsible for loss or injury to the exhibits or containers, though care will be taken to prevent loss or damage.
9. The decision of the judges, in all classes, is final.
10. Juniors entering adult classes are required to pay the \$.50 entry fee.
11. **Articles are on exhibit until 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 5th.**
12. **Please remove items immediately following.**
13. **Articles not removed will be left in the building at exhibitors' risk.**
